In 2021, we revamped our mission statement: to prevent pregnancy loss, childhood death, and disability due to congenital CMV. To achieve this mission, our Board of Directors and staff developed a detailed and targeted 3-year strategic plan – laying out the steps that we will take over the next three years towards our mission. I am thrilled to say that after our first year into this strategic plan, we have already begun to check items off that list. We sponsored the Congenital CMV Public Health and Policy Conference, updated our free educational materials, and continued to grow our network of allies throughout the country and world.

None of these achievements would be possible without your generous support! Thanks to your donations and in-kind gifts, we have been able to continue to push for change. 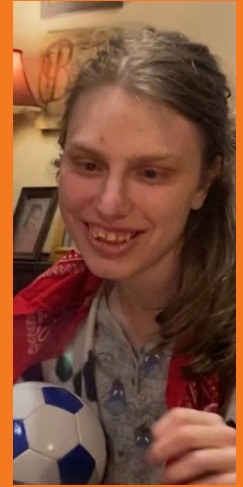
